Napoleon High School is a comprehensive, co-educational, public high school serving resident and school-of-choice students in grades 9-12. Enrollment has slowly declined, ranging between 380-400 students in recent years.

The professional staff consists of 21 teachers (including part-time and multibuilding teachers), 2 administrators, 2 secretaries, 2 part-time office paraprofessionals, 1 part-time instructional paraprofessional, and 2 part-time media center paraprofessionals.

Napoleon High School continues to focus on School Improvement goals for Math, Reading, and Writing. We are currently in the monitoring progress phases of our plan and meet regularly to collect, review and interpret data from state, local, and classroom assessment, as well as discuss the strategies being used at the building and classroom levels. Additionally, we have structured academic intervention time.

Through the Jackson County ISD, specialized educational services are provided to those students attending Napoleon High School.

The Jackson Area Career Center provides vocational programs, as well as an Early College program, to the students of Napoleon. On a daily basis, students were transported to the Career Center for their half-day career instruction, either morning or afternoon.

Through the recognition of individual student needs, programs within the school provide options for students. Special Education programs accommodate the maximum number of students possible for the high school Special Education staff. Through the IEP process, services supplied by the ISD, and Napoleon's local resources,

we provide a wide variety of services to students with special needs. Utilizing both the Resource Room and a co-teaching model, Special Education Services are also provided in the regular classroom setting. Teachers make adaptations and modifications to meet individual needs and enhance the learning environment. Napoleon students then have the best chance possible to be successful.

Napoleon High School is using the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) as is required by the State of Michigan Department of Education. We continue to focus on SAT/MME preparation in our curriculum through common assessments in corearea courses, until such time as those assessments are altered at the state level. One of the key links between home and school continues to be the parent/teacher conference. The resulting relationships between parents and teachers last far beyond the years that students attend and parents visit the staff. Because of the brevity of the 12-week trimesters, parents' monitoring of student performance is extremely important, as is maintaining open communication with teachers. Much communication between home and school utilizes email, telephone, and data systems (PowerSchool Parent Portal). Progress reports are distributed at the conferences, providing immediate opportunities for explanation of students' current status. Parents meet with instructors in teacher classrooms. Parents and teachers discuss student performance and strategies to improve performance and learning.

Number of students served at Parent-Teacher Conferences:

- Held October 16, 2014: 31% of students were represented by parents.
- Held January 15, 2015: 29% of students were represented by parents.
- Held October 17, 2013: 33% of students were represented by parents.
- Held January 16, 2014: 33% of students were represented by parents.

Many staff remain available before and after school and all are available on their preparation period if the scheduled conference time is not convenient. Both NHS teachers and administration appreciate our parents and this communication that is vital to the success of our students. We also have a free after-school tutoring & homework-help lab available Mondays thru Thursdays, staffed by teachers for 1 hour sessions.
