

# Napoleon High School JCEC Program

## Student Qualifying Criteria Information:

- College Readiness Scores based on the state requirements for dual enrollment
- GPA 2.5 or higher
- Good work ethic of classwork/homework completion
- Good School Attendance
- No Behavior Issues

## Napoleon High School Requirement

- Completion of \*Napoleon High School Graduation requirements by the end of the 13<sup>th</sup> year. \*This includes the requirements for the Michigan Merit Curriculum.

## Things to Consider:

- Students will be building a college transcript. The college grades earned will follow to all post secondary institutions that a student attends.
- To qualify for Federal Financial Student Aid a student must be passing 66.7% of their college courses. This is important for the 13<sup>th</sup> year.
- Federal Financial Aid cannot be determined for a student until the final year of high school when parents complete the FAFSA.
- A passing grade for college courses is a minimum of a 2.0.
- Students not obtaining a 2.0 in any college course will have to retake the course to earn a qualifying grade for the degree or transfer purposes.
- Napoleon High School does not cover any of the cost of courses that need to be retaken.
- Students not earning a 2.0 in any of their college courses will have to reimburse Napoleon Schools for the schools portion of the tuition.
- Students may not audit courses or take hobby, craft or religious college coursework.
- College Spring Break occurs at a different time from K-12 Spring Break. Students are expected to attend college courses during their high school Spring Break.
- The current allotted amount required by the State of Michigan for payment for college coursework for students at Napoleon High School is: \$549.57 per course, this may not cover the entire cost of the course, fees, books and materials
- Students must declare entry into the JCEC program by Spring of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade year.
- Students involved in this program will be spending the majority of the 12<sup>th</sup> grade year at Jackson College. If those students are athletes, they need to think about their sport and the times they are released early from class or miss school for competitions. The College courses/instructors will expect you to be in class.
- Students planning on playing college athletics will not be able to participate until after the 13<sup>th</sup> year. Students involved in high school athletics will not be able to participate in the 13<sup>th</sup> year.
- Students involved in band or choir must also think about the 12<sup>th</sup> grade year and consider the time they will be at the college. The 13<sup>th</sup> year students cannot perform in competitions.
