Chris Adams, M.S. principal reported that the middle school students placed at 61% with the new school index report card scoring system. Overall that placed us firmly in the 4<sup>th</sup> spot in the county. We have extremely bright students but also not so bright students that unfortunately due to a large achievement gap we were labeled and put on a list. The students overall are doing a great job and are doing great things in the building and hopefully next year we will not be labeled.

Pat Dillon, H.S. Co-principal reported that Mr. Draa took his students to a bridge building competition last week. There were 300 teams with around 900 students that participated state wide. Our juniors placed 24<sup>th</sup> and the freshman placed 48<sup>th</sup>. Great job team!

Shawn Murphy, maintenance director reported that their main goal this summer will be entering the bus schedules into Powerschool.

## Superintendent's Report

Just a quick reminder that our next board meeting will be on Tuesday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, the day after Memorial Day.

Kim Miller continues to work on our district budget. Hopefully soon I will be able to report to the board how it looks. I have met with the administrators to go over our staffing needs for next year and we have a plan in place to absorb the 1 ½ less special education teachers the ISD will fund for our district.

Edwin Payne, our social/emotional support specialist has held 14 sessions with eight freshman, two sophomores and two juniors. Themes in presenting issues include: poor academic performance resulting from challenges in parental dynamics at home, challenges in transitioning to H.S. and its structure. Potential students who recently experienced a loss were screened and eight students opted to be part of a grief group.

Our Ackerson Lk graduation will take place on Thursday, May 31<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 at the High School Cafetorium. I will give you reminders beforehand.
