Ackerson Lake is made up of students from around the county who bring a variety of educational experiences and personalities. We strive to offer small class sizes with low teacher to student ratios, as well as, individualized curriculum and career readiness opportunities. With our blend of online learning and traditional face to face classes, students are exposed to a variety of experiences and opportunities.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Most students here at Ackerson enroll by choice while some enroll by recommendation from surrounding area schools. All new and returning students and their guardians must meet with the building principal before enrollment is confirmed. We are continuing to track the data from implementing six week marking periods, the number of credits recovered due to targeted interventions, and data collected while operating under our state approved Reduced Hour/Day Waiver. Students and parents all have access to a checklist of class requirements, as well as, a monthly updated credit audit showing classes students have taken, current and needed credits, and grades received in classes they have completed. Many students have worked hard to get ahead on credits allowing them to be eligible for dual enrollment, work based learning, and expunging classes for a better grade.

Students who are on track to graduate, have good attendance, and minimal behavior issues can enroll at our county CTE program as juniors and seniors. Most of the programs offered contains embedded credits towards high school graduation and articulated credits towards college for students to earn.

We are proud of our school, community and the achievements of our students. We continue to strive for a future of perseverance and success.
